





To Whom It May Concern:

On Tuesday August 4th 2015 at approximately 7:00 a.m., my daughter and I witnessed what appeared to be a tornado/funnel cloud come down Victoria Lane.

I would like to commend the Town of Stoneham; Police and Fire Departments for their steadfast approach to safety. We had live wires in the street and in a yard. The DPW came in minutes, and my only regret is that I did not get all of their names. The DPW made an extremely dangerous and stressful situation very calm and safe. These dozen or so workers came and went to work. Within a matter of hours, the street looked better than it did before the storm. They came back in the afternoon and took down two dangerous trees, cleaned the sidewalks and street.

I would like to personally thank the Police, Fire and most of all the DPW. The service and their demeanor were exceptional.
